The Curriculum

Under the Education Reform Order, the responsibility of the Governors for the curriculum, ie. what is taught in school, has been increased. The Governors' control of the curriculum is, however, more apparent than real as much of what is taught has now been determined by law in the form of the Northern Ireland Curriculum. Generally, the day-to-day organisation of the curriculum remains the Principal's responsibility.

A broad and balanced learning experience is provided for all pupils attending Ballyoran Primary School. This has been achieved through the efforts of the Principal, Vice Principal, School Leadership Team, Subject Co-ordinators and Teachers spending many hours in discussion and planning to produce Policies and Schemes for use in the classroom and ensuring that classroom practice gives pupils the best learning opportunities possible.

The Curriculum Development Programme involved In-service Training, both inside and outside school on Baker Days, School Development Days and Directed Time throughout the year. The Programme involved all members of Staff working individually, in year groups, in key stage groups or as a whole staff team as appropriate and was supported by EA Advisers and other outside agencies.

The Northern Ireland Curriculum aims 'to empower young people to achieve their potential and to make informed and responsible decisions throughout their lives.' It has three objectives:

Attendance

Attendance continued to be a priority for improvement on the School Development Plan. The School continues to promote the DE Policy – ‘School Attendance – Every School Day Counts.’

The average Attendance % for 2024 - 2025 was 92.1%, this was a significant increase from 90.5% the previous year.

Fourteen pupils received awards for 100% at Prize Day, this was an increase from 2 pupils the previous year.

Although our attendance remained below the Northern Ireland Average, it was above the DE Benchmarking figure of 90.8% for schools within our free school meals category which is very pleasing.

Parents/guardians are to be thanked for ensuring that their children are in school every day.

Staff are also to be commended for their part in ensuring good attendance. Attendance levels are proof that pupils want to be in school every day because staff are making their educational experience motivating, interesting and meaningful.

Partnership with Parents

Links between the school and parents which are vital, continued to be fostered and encouraged in various ways during the 2024 - 2025 year:

Nursery and Year 1 Induction Meetings.

All parents were kept up to date with happenings in school through monthly News Sheets, monthly Nursery News Letters and Topic Sheets, School Website, The School App, See Saw, email and text messages.

Other Information Sheets and Permission Notices were issued regularly as and when required.

Parent/Teacher Meetings were held twice during the year.

A written Annual Report was issued to all Year 1 – 7 pupils and a Nursery Transition Form to all Nursery pupils in June.

Parents were able to make an appointment to speak to staff when required.

Our Parents & Friends Group continued.

Parents were surveyed on a range of issues using Online Forms.

We started a new school Facebook page during the 2024-2025 school year and this has proven to be a very successful outreach tool with a lot of very positive feedback from parents and the local community.

The Board of Governors, Principal and staff would like to take this opportunity of thanking all parents for the valuable contribution that they made in supporting the school during 2024 - 2025.

Community Links

At Ballyoran Primary School we believe that the link with the local community is vital. This relationship is a two-way process, the school reaches into the community and the community is welcomed into school.

Charity/Fundraising

The school continued its fundraising for a number of charities including BBC Children In Need, Samaritan’s Push Shoe Box Appeal, Northern Ireland Hospice, Northern Ireland Chest, Heart & Stroke and Reach. We would like to thank staff, pupils, parents and friends of the school for their support and generosity.

As well as supporting charities, parents were very generous in supporting our fundraising for a new Sensory Room for the Primary School, through events like our Fun Run in the People’s Park. We are very grateful to everyone who supported this effort but particular thanks must be given to the Cherry family and their business Cherry Pipes for their extremely generous donation of £6,000 which allowed us to reach our target much sooner than expected, meaning that we now have our new Sensory Room in operation, benefitting all of our pupils.

Inclusion and Diversity

We are an inclusive school and highly respect the cultural diversity within our school community. Newcomers continue to settle in the local community and our enrolment includes a significant number of pupils from 15 other countries including Portugal, Poland, Romania and Lithuania.

The school receives a significant amount of extra funding for its Newcomer pupils. To celebrate the fact that we are a diverse and inclusive school, as usual on 26th September 2025 we celebrated European Day of Languages. We also celebrated Mother Language Day.

Mrs Mackle took over the role of Inclusion and Diversity Co-ordinator during 2024-2025 and led the school to a successful Schools of Sanctuary Award in Term 3. This prestigious honour is a powerful recognition of our school's unwavering dedication to fostering a learning environment where every pupil feels welcomed, safe, included and supported. It was very much a highlight of the year.

First Holy Communion and Confirmation

Year 7 pupils were prepared for Confirmation which took place in March.

Year 4 First Holy Communion took place in May.

We are grateful for the pastoral support of our Chaplain Rev Father Sheehan, for his assistance in the organisation of the various celebrations.

Shared Education

Shared Education has been defined as education that will provide opportunities for children and young people from different community backgrounds to learn together. We again had a programme of activities for each year group with our partner, Bocombra Primary School.

Healthy Kidz

All primary pupils now benefit from the Healthy Kidz programme. Sessions included an initial assessment in week one and a further assessment in the final week to ascertain the level of progress. Central to the Healthy Kids programme was the Golden Mile where the pupils were encouraged to complete a circuit over a period of 15 minutes of either walking or running. The aim was very much to improve each pupil's level of fitness.

The school's programme of extra-curricular activities started again this year and these proved to be very popular with all of the pupils:

Extended Schools

The school again was fortunate to receive funding as part of the Department of Education's Extended Schools Programme whereby schools are encouraged to extend their activities beyond the normal school day. Many activities including Breakfast Club and Boosting Reading were possible because of this funding:

As well as our own school activities, the school is also the Lead School in an Extended Schools Cluster of Nursery, Primary and Post Primary schools.

Eco Schools

The school continued its valuable Eco work spearheaded by the Eco Committee.

Competitions

During the 2024 - 2025 school year, pupils enjoyed taking part in Art Competitions including the Credit Union Poster Competition, the school's Christmas Card Competition, an Anti-Bullying Poster Competition and a Knight's of St Columbanus Art Competition.

Healthy Breaks

Ballyoran Primary School is a Health Promoting School and has operated a Healthy Breaks Policy for many years. Nursery and Foundation Stage pupils are provided with a healthy snack each day by the school. Pupils in Years 3 – 7 are responsible for bringing in a healthy snack each day.

School Security

DENI 1998 regulations require formal information to be presented regarding school security. Please note the following:

- Visitor access control - during school hours all visitors to school must enter by the front door and report to reception, sign the Visitors' Book and get a Visitors' Pass which must be worn at all times.
- The front doors of the School, Nursery and Community Learning Centre are protected by electronic access controls.
- A closed circuit television system operates inside and outside school premises.
- Secure doors and windows.
- Fire Detection Systems - the school is fitted with a fully functional fire alarm.
- Computer security - information held on computer can only be accessed by using confidential passwords.
- All valuable assets are marked with DNA.
- Intruder Alarm - the school is protected by an intruder alarm system.
- Security lights cover the exterior of the building.
- A security fence is in place around the site.
